Janet McBeth Dawkins, 75, was born November 26, 1949, in Cross Anchor, SC. She departed from this life Monday, December 16, 2024. She was the daughter of the late James McBeth Sr. and Eunice Thompson McBeth.

Janet was a devoted employee with the Spartanburg Regional Health Care System, Spartanburg, SC, with a long rewarding career of 30 plus years in the Emergency Room Department. She was one of the first African American woman to serve in that position during a period when opportunities weren't available. She became well known for her work ethic and her ability to adapt to sometime chaotic situations. Through her career, she was a part of the medical team that affected people's lives, as they came through the emergency room doors. She lived a fast-paced career....and enjoyed every minute of it, even after she retired.
